### What do we do?

We are here for you...

...no matter who you are, or whatever your beliefs, our Chaplains will seek to support and care for you in whatever way we can.

### We offer:

- A friendly listening ear at a time of difficulty or crisis
- Space to talk about life, purpose and the meaning of things
- Help in bereavement
- Pastoral Counselling
- Support if you wish to pratise your faith or tradition
- Contact with representatives of world faith communities and belief groups

- Above all, total compassion, understanding, and confidentiality.

## Who are we?

The Chaplaincy team is based in the hospital and represents, or is in contact with, all major faiths and denominations. This experienced team is comprised of ministers, priests and volunteers from a range of beliefs and in a variety of capacities, male and female, working together throughout the hospital.

# It's good to talk

It can be an anxious time when we are admitted to hospital. We are away from the comfort of home, and we may be feeling unwell, and awaiting procedures or the results of tests.

What we think about things: ourselves; our lives; what really matters; may be at the forefront our our minds. Perhaps it is because somebody close to us is unwell, and we find ourselves watching and waiting with them...

We are trying to hold everything together, and sometimes we need help.

Whatever your circumstances and beliefs, and whether you are a patient or relative, you might find it helpful to talk in confidence to someone about what is going on.

# We are here for the whole of the hospital community

We are here for patients, relatives, visitors and members of staff. We work closely together to care for people of all faiths and traditions and for those without any religious affiliation. Spiritual and pastoral care is for everyone. We will respond to everyone who asks to see us and respect their beliefs.

# The Chapel

Apart from 'formal' services (when it is asked that the chapel and particular faith tradition be respected) the chapel is always open for reflection, quiet time or prayer.

# **Prayer Room**

A Muslim prayer room (equipped with foot washing facilities) is available next to the Chapel. This is open 24 hours a day.
